Lesson Seven: Make a Picture Storybook Two

Learning Area: The Arts

Strands: Media Arts

Time: 45 Minutes

Year Level: F-2

Content Descriptor:

- Create short imaginative, informative and persuasive texts using growing knowledge of text structures and language features for familiar and some less familiar audiences, selecting print and multimodal elements appropriate to the audience and purpose (ACELY1671).
- Create short texts to explore, record and report ideas and events using familiar words and beginning writing knowledge (ACELY1651).
- Recreate texts imaginatively using drawing, writing, performance and digital forms of communication (ACELT1586).

Learning Focus:

- Students write a short blurb for the back cover of their storybooks that summarises their completed book.

Time:	Teaching and Learning Strategies:	Preparation and Resources:
45 minutes	Write a blurb To offer more of a writing challenge, students can write a short blurb that summarises their story on the back cover of their storybook. To reflect on their learning, students prepare questions to ask a friend or the class about their interpretation of each other's story. They could use the 'Let's reflect' questions on the last page of the Plan Your Photostory activity sheet as a guide. They could draft and ask questions such as: • What were the names of my characters? • What did my characters do in my story? • What sort of ending did my story have? Students write and reply to these questions in a journal and could also draw pictures of these characters.	Relevant ARTS:LIVE resources • Plan Your Photostory activity sheet.
