Haiku Poetry

Haiku Poems are a short traditional Japanese poem usually written about the seasons or nature.

The following structure is often used to compose a Haiku poem:

Line one: 5 syllables

Line two: 7 syllables

Line three: 5 syllables

The examples below are written in response to the Noongar season Bunuru.
Bunuru is the second summer season from February to March.
